Childhood Cancer Community Faces Complex Knowledge Mobilization Needs and Barriers

A scoping review of 77 studies including 27,888 professionals and 50,786 patient, 1467 parents or caregivers, and 247 families was conducted (Moussa et al., 2025). Studies included 201,298 written website or social media content and 149 videographic content found on video sharing platforms. Knowledge mobilization needs include:

- Support Training and education
- Information and communication
- Medical management

Primary Objectives: (1) Describe and prioritize the knowledge mobilization needs of the childhood cancer community in Canada from an adult perspective; (2) Establish a sustainable strategic plan to build knowledge mobilization capacity locally and nationally

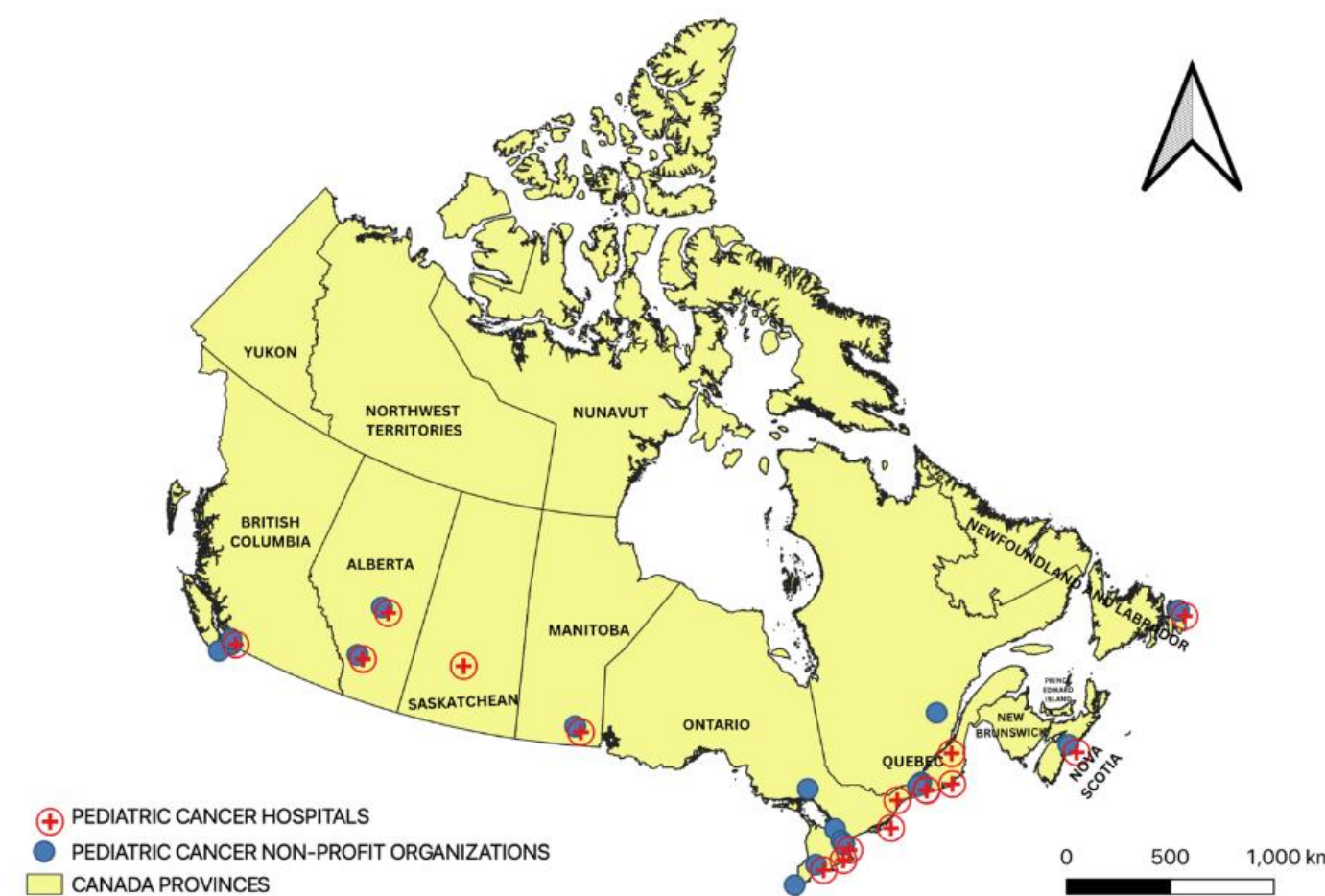
Secondary Objectives: (1) Develop, use, and appraise the multi-modal social media and internet-mediated recruitment methods; (2) Develop strategies to define, identify and engage the childhood cancer community population

Study Methods: Overseen by an Advisory Council (n = 20), a community-based participatory, concurrent, triangulated, mixed methods research design is underway. Data sources: survey, focus groups, interviews, observations, field notes and key texts. Data are being descriptively and thematic analyzed and will be triangulated.

Preliminary Results: ACCESS project teams have strong persons with lived experience (PWLE) co-lead involvement and active dissemination but there are clear gaps in comprehensive and inclusive knowledge mobilization planning.

Impact/Outcome: Collaboratively generate context-specific and sustainable knowledge mobilization strategies, build capacity, and make a global impact.

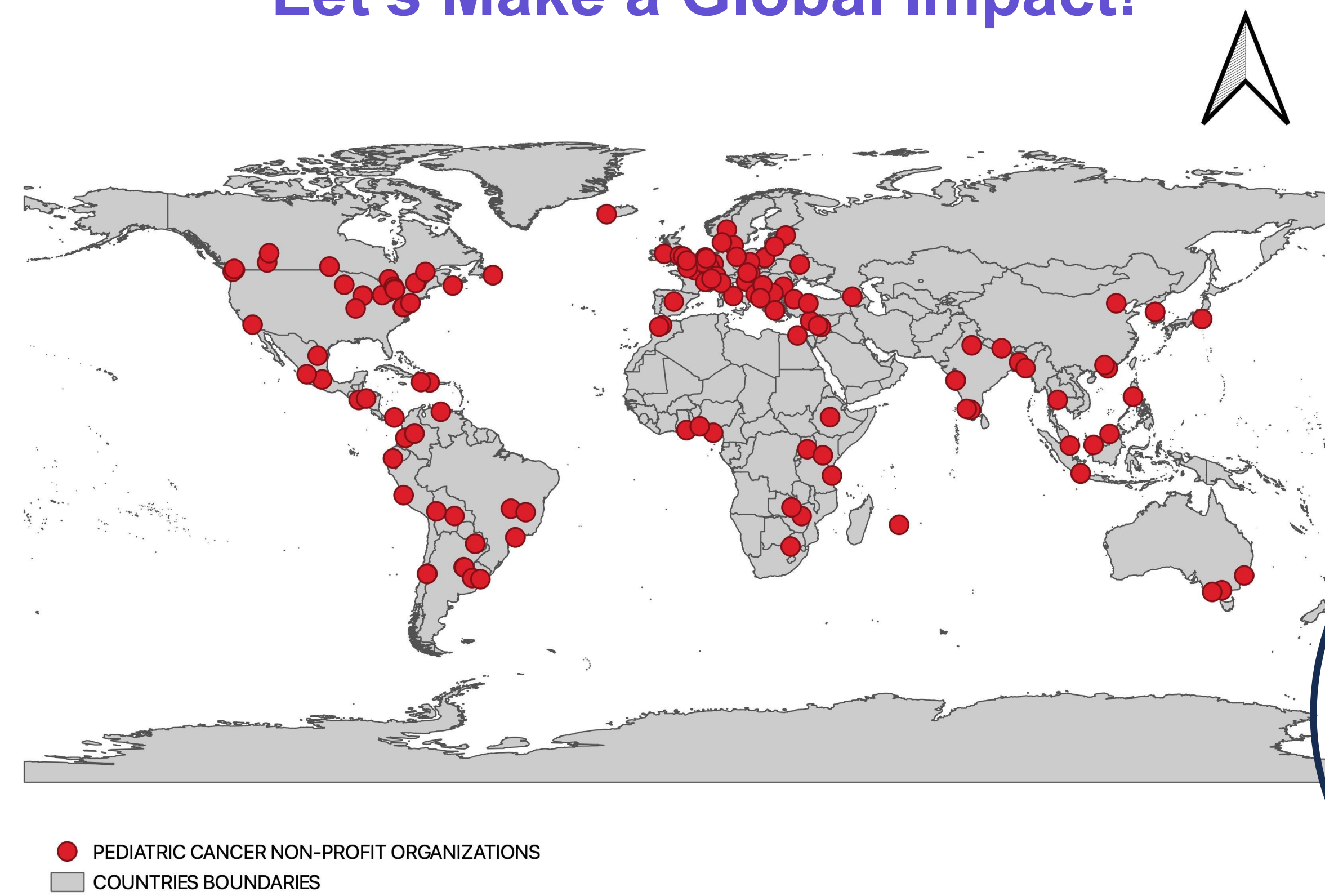
