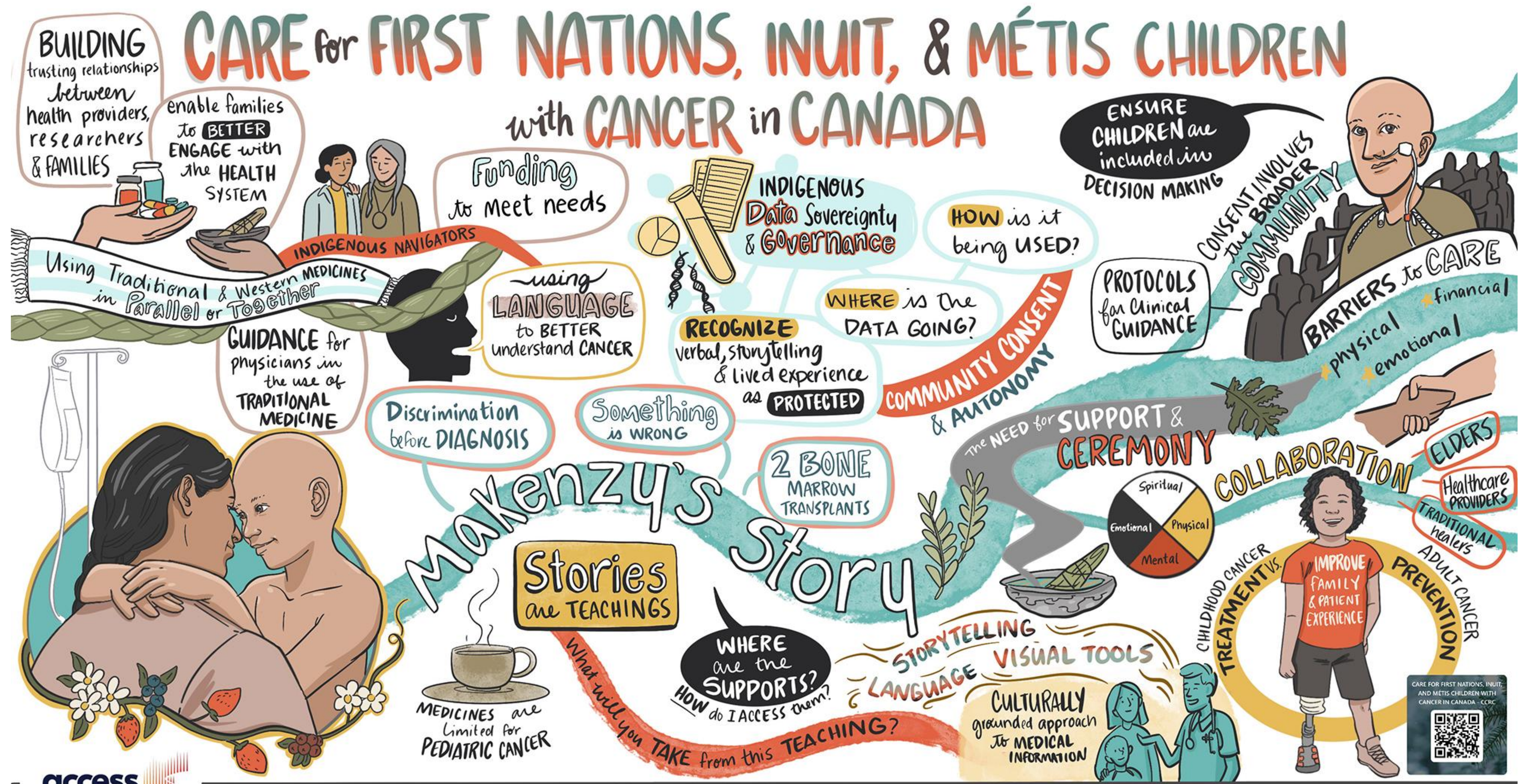


# Canadian Cancer Research Conference: Community-Engaged Discussion

## OBJECTIVE

We led a community-engaged workshop to gather information about the most pressing priorities in the care and wellbeing for First Nations, Inuit and Métis (FNIM) children, families and communities affected by childhood cancer and begin to formulate an approach to addressing these issues.

## METHODS

- The workshop began with ceremony led by a community Elder
- The discussion was centred through the story of one family's cancer journey, to reflect some of the common challenges faced by FNIM families
- Background information about what is known regarding the outcomes and experiences of FNIM children and families with cancer in Canada was shared, as well as information about data sources available for future work
- Through participant dialogue, themes emerged and were captured in the visual graphic above

- The gathering represented the beginning of engagement with community
